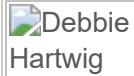

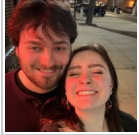

“*Mr. Jarski made a difference in my children's lives and education. My youngest daughter spent some time out west and the only means of communication that I had with her at that time was letters. I can't count how many times our letters reference Mr. Jarski. It was like he was out there in the Great Basin camping under the stars with her. He was a guiding light and he will be forever missed. To the Jarski family, I pray for comfort as you walk through these days. I would like to make an analogy to glacial landscape - because I lack people skills. A granitic erratic is a boulder that is nonnative to the area that was carried there by a glacier. You are in a place where you would never expect to be, but it's where life carried you. And then there are drumlins, eskers, and three levels of glacial beach - Glenwood, Calumet Toleston. The land is scarred from the weight and pressure of the glaciers, and there are three levels of beach because it didn't recede all at once. Just like the land after a glacier, things just aren't what they were before, and the three levels of beach show that it didn't go away all at once. It was gradual. It will feel better one day. Not today. Not tomorrow. Not for a long time, but when you look back, you might be able to see landmarks of how things eventually got better.
